

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

For well over a century people have confidently declared that the tide is going out on Christianity. Over the last few decades many in our country have spoken as if the tide is turning against Jesus. 
What kind of church are we?

The way we get on with looking to God to turn the tide for Jesus is by getting on with the key things God wants us to care about. For this reason we care about genuine love for God and genuine love for each other. We care about love that's deeply shaped by God's word as we faithfully follow the example of Jesus our Lord. And as our love for God grows, so does our desire to lead other people to Jesus. If you've been around Trinity Church Modbury for more than a few weeks hopefully you can already see that the Holy Spirit leads us to be a people who are grace filled. We stand before God by

grace alone and we stand alongside each other extending that same grace (Galatians 5:16-26). The Holy Spirit leads us to be **Bible anchored**. God makes himself known to us in his word and so we want to listen to him (2) Timothy 3:14-4:5). The Holy Spirit leads us to be **courageous**. We take courage to live for Jesus and to lead people to Jesus. We make courageous decisions individually and as a church (2 Timothy 1:6-14). Finally, the Holy Spirit leads us to be **community hearted**. We strive to value each and every person in our church family (1 Corinthians 12:7-13:13).

Our growth past, present (and future?)

Over our 15 year history it's clear that God has been at work as we've grown and planted and grown again 3 times. What is even more remarkable is the overall growth God has enabled through these church plants in our region (see the red line above). For this reason our prayer is that over the next 5 years God would enable us to plant <u>3 more churches</u> in partnership with the 3 churches we've already planted. Our prayer is that God would use these 7 churches (alongside other faithful churches) to double the impact we're currently having in Adelaide's North as together we declare to the world that Jesus Christ is Lord. The first step for us is to send around 40 people in the 2nd half of 2026 to plant an Evening Church. This means the next 12 months are an important time of preparation. To be in a good place to do this we'd love to grow by 40 more people present on a Sunday with us. Over this time we'd also love to grow not just numerically but in many other ways (some of which you'll read about in the rest of this report).

Our financial position

God has always provided wonderfully for Trinity Church Modbury through the generosity of his people and we're confident he will continue to do so. Giving to our church enables us to employ the staff we need, raise up Ministry Apprentices (like Ben Goddard), rent our facilities (Modbury Primary; U3A; Playgroup), run our evangelistic Life series, Seek Youth, and all our other ministries. It also enables us to be in a strong and healthy position in order to send out more churches so that we might see the tide turned for Jesus.


This year, as of the beginning of April we have a deficit of \$8465. Given that our total accumulated

surplus is now just \$12936 the Leadership Team has brought to our attention our need to lift our giving (Dec 15 2024 & Mar 2 2025). The way we have prayerfully decided to try and do this is by asking members not giving to start; asking members already giving to consider increasing their giving by 10%; and by asking everyone to welcome in new members who want to partner with us in the work we're doing.

At the AGM (11:45am 4 May 2025) we will be able to give an update on how our church has responded to this need.





Our leaders and their roles

Our Leadership Team consists of our chair, Michael Physick; Jane Dewing (Senior Pastor appointed positions); Carine Tang (Congregation elected position); Simon Barbour & Daryll Pain (Leadership Team appointed positions); & Stephen George (Senior Pastor). Michael Physick has moved from an elected position to a Senior Pastor appointed position and hence <u>there is a vacancy for an elected position</u> to be filled at the AGM. Our staff team consists of Sally Oster (part-time 2 days per week); Mark Curran (full-time); Stephen George (full-time); Debbie Edwards (part-time 2 days per week) and Ben Goddard (Ministry Apprentice). According to 'Reach Australia' a healthy staffing level is somewhere between 1 FTE pastoral staff member (excluding apprentices) to every 65–90 people in attendance on a Sunday. We currently have 1 FTE staff to 87 people. This means as we keep growing we may be stretching staff capacity to lead and care well for our church.

How has God been at work in our Magnification?

We want everyone at Trinity Church Modbury to continually grow in loving God, which is the foundation of loving each other and leading people to Jesus. Primarily we foster love for God communally through our Sunday services by means of singing, prayer, studying the Bible, testimonies and the Lord's Supper. Time and effort, by individuals and teams, is put into Sunday services to help our hearts and minds dwell on and respond rightly to God as we gather. It's uplifting to look around during our church services and see people fully engaged as they focus on God.

We foster love for God outside Sunday services through regularly engaging in private devotional activities such as personal Bible reading, prayer and singing. This year booklets for both our Mark and Isaiah series provided daily readings for reflection and suggestions for personal prayer (Isaiah booklet only).

We urgently need one or two more people who have natural abilities that would enable them to be trained up in operating the sound desk at Modbury. We'd also love to have more people join each of our magnification teams so that we're in a great position for planting an evening service next year.

I've been blessed by the faithful, ongoing serving of many in the various teams and by the ongoing influx of new team members which is energising. Did you know there are two people currently learning drums to serve our church community and free Ben Goddard up for other ministry?




How has God been at work in our Membership?

Our love for God drives us to love each other. As a church we really do strive to be grace-filled and community hearted. I frequently see evidence that we're keen to welcome others as they come to faith, or join our church.

When you look around on a Sunday you will see about 215 people. But what you might not see is that overall we are a community of about 250 regulars (~175 adults ~35 youth ~40



kids) and at any given time around 7% of people amongst us are newish to



our church. For this reason we ask every one of us to be really welcoming and quick to meet people & care for them. We also work hard at having a team on a Sunday to help care for people, and we run Onboard 4 times a year.

Membership is also about building and caring for our church community. We try to build community through things like our church camp, our bonfire night, potluck lunches, walks and other events.

Pastoral Care predominantly happens through Community Groups, in addition to each of our pastoral staff (Mark, Sally, Stephen, Ben) playing a key role in this.

Pray that God would enable us to make progress on starting a pastoral/practical care team into 2026 (meals/visiting/practical care).

How has God been at work in our Maturity?
